# **BUHSD Learning Center Edgenuity Enrollment Instructions**

Welcome to BUHSD LC Online! Here are some important instructions to get you started with your online Edgenuity courses. Edgenuity is the online learning platform we use for your classes. Please be sure to read this **entire** message, and do not hesitate to email us if you have any questions.

# **ACCESSING EDGENUITY (STUDENTS)**

The easiest way to access your class is to go to the District's website: <a href="www.buhsd.org">www.buhsd.org</a>. Click on BUHSD Learning Center at the top of the main page. Go to Programs and click on LC Online. Scroll down and click on Edgenuity Student Login. You can also access your class(es) through <a href="http://learn.edgenuity.com/student">http://learn.edgenuity.com/student</a>. If you are a continuing Edgenuity student, your login information is the same as it was before. If you are new to Edgenuity, your **District Email** (ID@buhsd.org) is your Username (unless notified otherwise), and your **Password** is the <a href="first">first</a> three letters of your first name, the <a href="first">first</a> three letters of your last name, and the <a href="first">first</a> three digits of your school ID number.

For example, the username for Marissa Lees, ID 23564 would be 23564@buhsd.org, and the password would be marlee235.

If you are new to Edgenuity, after your initial login, you will be required to view short orientation videos. These will demonstrate how to navigate and access various parts of Edgenuity. You must view these before you can access your class(es).

# **CLASSES**

Before you start your class(es), make sure you have been enrolled in the correct class(es). All full-time online students should be enrolled in classes equal to **4.0 credits**. Keep in mind that some Edgenuity classes are worth a half (.50) credit; therefore, you will have more than 4 classes if you are taking any half-credit electives. If you feel there has been an error with the class(es) you've been assigned, please email Mrs. Lees at mlees@buhsd.org as soon as possible.

Please note that if you are enrolled in a **Spanish** class, there is a speaking, writing, and reading component; therefore, **headphones with a microphone** are required.

Also, note that if you are taking ISP (Integrated Science Principles), you will be assigned ISP IA and ISP IB at the same time in Edgenuity. Both are half-credit courses, so *together* they equal the required freshman science full credit. ISP IA consists of standards from Physical Science, and ISP IB consists of standards from Earth and Space Science. Because they are each composed of different science standards, one does not need to be taken before or after the other; they can be taken simultaneously.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

All full-time online students must log a minimum of **5 hours** in their Edgenuity classes <u>each school day</u>. In other words, in a full school week, a full-time online student should work at least **25 hours** in their Edgenuity classes. Not only is this minimum time requirement tied to student attendance, it directly correlates to student achievement. Students can find the time they have logged by going into their Edgenuity Profile (upper right corner in Edgenuity) and then clicking on Attendance Report (left side of the screen).

### ACCESSING THE FAMILY PORTAL IN EDGENUITY (PARENTS/GUARDIANS)

Edgenuity offers a Family Portal where parents/guardians can check on their child's progress in their Edgenuity classes. First, parents/guardians, you must activate your Family Portal.

**Note**: You will need a unique **Activation Code** to activate your Family Portal. To obtain your personal Activation Code, please send an email to all three of us: <a href="mailto:mleas@buhsd.org">mlees@buhsd.org</a> (Mrs. Lees), <a href="mailto:ctellez@buhsd.org">ctellez@buhsd.org</a> (Ms. Tellez), and <a href="mailto:ksanders@buhsd.org">ksanders@buhsd.org</a> (Dr. Sanders). You will just need to provide your student's full name and ID number on the email. One of us will reply to your email with your Activation Code.

The easiest way to access the Edgenuity Family Portal is to go to the District's website: <a href="www.buhsd.org">www.buhsd.org</a>. Click on BUHSD Learning Center at the top of the main page. Go to Programs and click on LC Online. Scroll down and click on Edgenuity Parent Login. You can also directly access the Family Portal at <a href="https://auth.edgenuity.com/Login/Login/Family">https://auth.edgenuity.com/Login/Login/Family</a>. Next, you will click on Activate Account (small link on the bottom right). Then, type in your email address that you provided on your student's online application and your Activation Code. You will then be asked to create a password and security question. Finally, you can log in and see how your child is progressing in his/her classes, current grades, and time logged in Edgenuity. You will also receive weekly progress reports straight to your email once you've activated your Family Portal. Feel free to watch the helpful tutorial video under LCOnline Resource Videos by going to our website at <a href="https://blc.buhsd.org/">https://blc.buhsd.org/</a>.

Note: You will NOT be able to see your child's grades on Parent Vue, as Edgenuity does not communicate with Parent Vue. You will have to use the Family Portal to see grades and attendance for your student.

# **QUIZZES AND TESTS**

In your Edgenuity classes, you will encounter quizzes for each lesson. If you fail a quiz or a test, you may retake it one time. However, cumulative exams (mid-terms and finals) can only be taken once; there are NO retakes on exams. Any time you are stopped in your course, you must email the teacher who facilitates the course, letting him/her know that you are stopped and need help. See the Teacher Facilitation Chart at the end of this document. Note that teachers are given a 24-hour window to respond to requests.

#### **GRADES**

Edgenuity shows **three** types of grades, and it is important that you understand what each one means. First, the **Overall Grade** is the grade you have earned on the portions of the course that you have completed. In other words, this shows the quality of work you are doing and if you are understanding the course's content. Second, the **Actual Grade** is the student's overall grade adjusted if a student is behind target. The Actual Grade incorporates a penalty for a student being behind their target. It makes use of a ratio that represents the student's actual progress divided by his/her target progress. If you are on-track or ahead of schedule with your course, the Actual Grade will be the same as the Overall Grade. Only if you begin falling behind in completing your coursework will the Actual Grade be lower than the Overall Grade. Third, the **Relative Grade** is the grade earned including a 0% for ALL components remaining incomplete in the entire course. In other words, Edgenuity assigns a zero for EVERYTHING in the course, and as you complete work, those zeros transform into the grade you've earned. As you complete work in the course, your Relative Grade will increase. The Relative Grade will be the posted grade on your high school transcript.

Note: You will NOT be able to see your grades on Student Vue, as Edgenuity does not communicate with Student Vue. You will need to check your Edgenuity Progress Report for your grades. Feel free to watch the helpful tutorial on Edgenuity Progress Reports video under LCOnline Resource Videos.

**Important:** Plagiarism is presenting other's words/ideas as your own without giving credit to the original author. It is also copying directly from another person/source and presenting the work as your own. Plagiarism is NOT allowed. All work must be your own. Do NOT copy work from another person or the Internet. If you use words from another person, you must put quotation marks around the exact words quoted and give credit to

the author. If you paraphrase information from a person/source, you must give credit to the author. Teachers use Turnitin.com to check for plagiarism. This website will check your work against everything on the Internet as well as all work that has ever been submitted to Turnitin.com. Plagiarism is a violation of the district's code of conduct, and any work that shows up plagiarized will result in a zero for the assignment, a referral will be written, and the violation may be entered on the student's school discipline profile.

# **RECEIVING HELP**

### **Academic Issues/Questions**

Whenever you have questions about your specific classes, please reach out to the teacher who is responsible for facilitating your class. Please refer to the **Teacher Facilitation Chart** at the end of this document to determine which teacher is responsible for facilitating which class.

Note that teachers will monitor classes during weekends, most school breaks/holidays, and evenings; however, during Winter Break, there are 5 days (Dec. 23 - 25, Dec. 31, and Jan. 1) that teachers are not expected to work. This only pertains to students taking credit deficiency, credit recovery, acceleration, and repeat classes, as they are the only students allowed to work on classes over Winter Break.

One useful tool that you should take advantage of is the **Course Map**. I have set your courses with a specific Target End Date. All work, including your final/cumulative test(s)/exam(s) must be completed by your Target End Date. Edgenuity automatically calculates what you need to complete each day to stay on target in the Course Map for each class so that you will complete the class by your Target End Date. You have 24/7 access to your coursework, so feel free to work ahead of the Course Map schedule.

<u>Tip:</u> Edgenuity follows our District Calendar and does NOT assign new work on <u>weekends and school</u> <u>breaks/holidays</u>; however, because you can still work in your classes during these days, you can get caught up or get ahead more easily by choosing to work during these days!
